Moscow Career Technical Education (CTE) guest speakers Kim O'Neill and Jim Miller talked to the attending members about a CTE that they wish to implement at Moscow high school and eventually open a new facility. This program works to apply technical training and education to areas such as math, science, and technology. There are currently limited programs through Moscow High School, but they would like to extend these courses to appeal to a broader range of student interests. This program is intended to offer students certificate programs through hands on experience in leadership and specialized training that can then be applied to any higher education or training

courses. There is a survey being circulated throughout Moscow High School and they asked that Moscow High students take it and encourage other students to also participate. Additionally, there will be a meeting at the Best Western in Moscow on April 10 at 6 p.m.

Sub Committee Update, Eleanor is finding catering, but the location will be at Moscow City Hall. It will be from 12-2 on May 18th. The talking points are: Free food, group activities, and honoring first responders. Eleanor has sent our grocery store assignments for food requests.
