In the past few weeks members were assigned to grocery stores to ask for donations: Rosauers/Walmart are pending approval, Safeway will be visited within the next few weeks, and Winco will only give donations to school sponsored activities. The Kitchen Counter is providing 40 Servings of cream based soup, the Co-op will have 6 total quiche with 8 servings each and a large fruit platter. All donations will be acknowledged at the bruncheon. There will also be a press release at least a week before to provide information and request journalists to attend. The talking points are: Free food, group activities, honoring first responders. Eleanor has sent our grocery store assignments for food requests.

The track meet two weeks ago was unsuccessful, few people showed any sort of interest and the commotion of the track meet was distracting. It has been concluded that spring sports are not very effective.

City clean up was successful and had a large turn out, thank you to all of the members who attended. The Farmers Market Bell Brigade will allow MYAC to participate in the market and have a free booth to attract community members. It was decided to request a space on May 4, May 11, and May 25. Sophia will email Amanda to ask about availability.

Jenny Ford from the Moscow Chamber of Commerce has asked us if we want to help with a silent auction for community businesses on the evening of June 1.

Last meeting it was discussed that Tami Poe from Good Samaritan's of Moscow asked us to do a project with the older citizens. It was decided to invite her to an upcoming meeting to talk about specifics for this project.
