Tina Hilding gave the report and a brief background of the work the subcommittee has been working on for new member, Jassen. They are planning a public forum for the end of January. Jeff Hicke may be able to help with organizing a graduate seminar for students next semester regarding developing mitigation and adaptation ideas. Jeff Cronan an Architect Professor at the University of Idaho asked CAWG to attend a presentation that his architect students are working on in regards to the New Green Deal. The next presentation will be December 11, 2020. There is talk of CAWG presenting the impact assessment to City Council later this year.

7. Moscow as a Bee City – Cassandra Goodmansen (A)

Cassandra will discuss an initiative for Moscow to become a ‘Bee City USA’. This idea is also being supported by the University of Idaho Extension program, a citizen-based Pollinator Working Group, and by the MHS Environmental Club. This coalition is looking for support from the SEC as the initiative moves forward to City Council

ACTION: Receive the report and vote on support of the initiative.

They are working to add “Making Moscow a Bee City” to the next pollinator summit. For the upcoming year at the summit the theme will be based on “getting everyone involved-yourself, your community, the whole world.” They will be inviting people to make pollinator art for this event, as well as getting involved with local pollinator programs/projects, and looking into different apps that are available that promotes pollinator monitoring. SEC helped funded the Pollinator Summit last year, and will look to help funding for next year.
