5. Third Street Gallery Exhibition Ideas for 2022 (DISCUSSION)

The Third Street Gallery (TSG) opened in September 1997, and since that time it has presented the work of local and regional artists on the second and third floors of City Hall. The TSG currently features new exhibitions on a quarterly basis, a schedule that is contingent upon the City's budget process. MAC members and Arts staff collaborate to determine the structure and topic of each show as well as the artists represented. Members of the public and City staff occasionally suggest ideas for exhibitions; these suggestions are kept in a document for the MAC's TSG subcommittee to review while drafting recommendations for each year's exhibition schedule. The TSG subcommittee's recommended schedule is adopted and operationalized following a majority vote during a regular MAC meeting. At that point, all artist communications, registration processes, music and catering contracts, promotional efforts, and other Gallery operations are implemented by Arts staff.

The Third Street Gallery subcommittee has requested that the MAC review the full history of exhibitions and contribute initial thoughts about what shows might be appropriate for the upcoming calendar year. The Gallery aims to keep audiences engaged by avoiding the repetition of media or thematically-focused exhibitions that have been presented in recent years. Similarly, the Gallery schedule balances the presentation of invitational, juried, open call, and solo/two-person exhibitions. Slots available for exhibition are as follows:

January – March
April – June
July – September
October - December

6. Mayor's Arts Awards Call for Nominations (ACTION ITEM)

The Events and Programs subcommittee has collaborated to create proposed updates to the Mayor's Arts Awards (MAA) call for nominations, which is set to open in March 2022. Proposed changes to the MAA program structure are based upon the reflections and observations of MAC and Arts staff members during the MAA 2020 process. Updates include a formalized selection process for awardees and award makers; adjustments to nominator, awardee, and selection panel member eligibility; and the addition of selection criteria for each award category. A majority vote of MAC members is needed to send this document for the Mayor's approval.

PROPOSED ACTION: Recommend the Mayor's Arts Awards call for nominations, or take such other action deemed appropriate.

7. Portable Collection Donation (ACTION ITEM)

Five works by artist Pam Overholtzer have been offered as a donation to the City's Portable Collection. Overholtzer comes from a long line of artists with a lifelong passion for design, art and craft. She maintained an interior design practice focused on historic architecture and interiors before returning to college to study architecture at the University of Idaho where she earned a Master of Architecture degree and research-oriented Master of Science degree. The seeds for this project began when Pam first saw Lillian Ottness's well-known book "*A Great Good Country*," and particularly Lillian's sketches of the historic buildings in downtown Moscow. While working on City Hall's Centennial Art Show at the Third Street Gallery as a member of the Moscow Historic Preservation Commission, she had an opportunity to work directly with Ottness's original drawings. Musing about the sketches, Pam sought a way to apply her artistic talent, a penchant for detail-oriented projects, and model-building skills to three dimensional interpretations of Ottness's beautiful sketches in the form of small, multi-dimensional models mounted in shadow boxes. The donation is offered by architect and longtime City of Moscow Planning & Zoning and Historic Preservation Commission member Wendy McClure.

Section VII.B.2 of the 2021 Public Art Guidelines outlines the following steps regarding the donation of works to the City's Portable Collection:

- a. Donor contacts appropriate City staff to discuss the potential gift, providing photos or the actual artwork.
- b. Arts Program Manager presents consideration of the gift to the MAC. If presented in graphic form, the MAC reserves the right to postpone any decision until the actual artwork is reviewed.
- c. Arts Program Manager (in consultation with MAC and as approved of by City Council) accepts or declines the gift. If accepted, the donor is acknowledged (if requested).

- d. Funds for maintenance are agreed upon by the donor and Arts Program Manager and deposited by the donor into a public art maintenance fund.

The Public Art Subcommittee recommends acceptance of this donation and states a preference for keeping all five works together in a single display location. Staff does not anticipate the need for maintenance funds to support this series. Professional photographs will be needed to document each work, which is a standard part of the accession process. Upon a majority vote by the MAC, staff will bring the donation recommendation for City Council consideration.

PROPOSED ACTION: Recommend acceptance of artwork donation, or take such other action deemed appropriate.

1. Reading of the Mission Statement

2. Approval of Moscow Arts Commission March 9, 2021 Minutes (ACTION ITEM)

PROPOSED ACTION: Approve minutes, amend minutes, or take such other action deemed appropriate.

McCleary moved, Foard seconded to approve the March 9, 2021 Minutes.

4. MAC Onboarding (DISCUSSION)

- Topic: Moscow Poet Laureate Program History

Gilmore stated Alexandra Teague helped build the Moscow Poet Laureate program out of a need for representation of the poetry community of Moscow. Tiffany Midge served as the first Moscow Poet Laureate (MPL) from 2015-2018. Gilmore stated Midge represented poetry as an approachable art. The second MPL, Susan Hodgins, is nearing the end of her three-year term in June. The Moscow Poet Laureate program helps promote the expansion on literature and the impact of literature in the community.

5. Mayor's Arts Awards Selection Panel Membership (DISCUSSION)

Following the updated selection processes utilized during the 2020 Mayor's Arts Awards (MAA), the Events & Programs subcommittee has been working to refine the 2022 MAA Call for Nominations. That document will be brought to the full MAC for discussion and revision as needed, followed by a vote to recommend the document for the Mayor's approval. At this stage of development, the subcommittee requests Commission input on the Selection Panel membership structure. The proposed model is as follows:

Voting members:

3 – Moscow Arts Commission Members

1 – Arts & Culture Community Representative

1 – Past Mayor's Arts Awards Recipient

Non-voting members:

Arts Department Staff (Selection Panel facilitation)

Johnson asked what would happen if a former award winner did not want to participate? Gilmore answered the past Mayor's Arts Awards recipient could be anyone who has won recently, not just within the last round of selection. She continued if someone declines the next person on the list could be contacted.

6. Moscow Poet Laureate 2021-2024 RFQ (ACTION ITEM)

The Arts & Culture Education subcommittee has collaborated to create proposed updates to the RFQ for the next Moscow Poet Laureate. Upon approval, the RFQ is set to be released in April 2021. Updates to the MPL program structure are reflected in the RFQ language, which was last released to the public during the selection period for MPL 2018-2021. Updates include the addition of a formalized selection process and changes to the honorarium, submission requirements, and scope of work required of the selected candidate.

PROPOSED ACTION: Approve the Moscow Poet Laureate RFQ, or take such other action deemed appropriate.

McCleary stated the updated RFQ clearly sets expectations for the selected Moscow Poet Laureate. Additionally, there was an alignment of the term start with that of the new fiscal year. In 2021 there will be a slight gap between terms. McCleary also stated the selection panel will include a youth member, an invitation to the former Moscow Poet Laureate, a literature community member and two MAC members.

The Commission members discussed what elements that defined a published poet. Caisley recommended using the literary representative as a resource to vet publication sources.

The Commission also discussed the development of the Moscow Poet Laureate program graphic in early 2020, how the RFQ will be advertised, and how the updates to the RFQ help to eliminate the over-extension of the selected representative.

Foard moved, Johnson seconded to approve the Moscow Poet Laureate RFQ as presented.

Roll Call Vote: Ayes: Unanimous. Nays: None. Abstentions: None. Motion carried.

7. Public Art Guidelines (ACTION ITEM)

The Public Art Subcommittee proposes updates to the Public Art Guidelines. The previous document was created in 2011. During the intervening years, MAC and Arts staff have recognized the need for greater clarity in the areas of location prioritization as well as selection processes and criteria for each part of the Public Art collection. Additionally, the City of Moscow Legal Department has provided updates to ensure that the document is in alignment with City code.

PROPOSED ACTION: Recommend approval of the Public Art Guidelines, or take such other action deemed appropriate.

Gilmore suggested the last page, last paragraph, second sentence to edit the pronoun “her” to “their”. Cherry stated she will speak with the Legal Department regarding the use of pronouns throughout the document.

Clancy moved, Foard seconded to recommend approval of the Public Art Guidelines with the suggested edits.

Roll Call Vote: Ayes: Unanimous. Nays: None. Abstentions: None. Motion carried.

REPORTS

1. Arts & Culture Education (McCleary)

MACTivities Toolbox #3 will launch in the spring. Toolbox #4 will focus on public art in Moscow and the hope is to release it in the summer. The subcommittee also discussed moving the survey to Submittable and utilize the registration process to capture the data. The April Poetry Relay is Thursday, April 15 and there are currently 21 registered attendees.

2. Events & Programs (Gilmore)

The subcommittee discussed the 2022 Mayor’s Arts Awards nomination RFP and received an operations update regarding Artwalk registration.

3. Public Art (Clancy)

The vinyl wrap designs for 2021 were selected by the Vinyl Wraps Selection Panel. Installation will be completed in early summer. Additionally, the vinyl wrap artwork sites for 2022 have been selected. The ITC Sculpture Garden call for artists is open now and closes on April 19. Clancy stated an RFP draft is in the works for the memorial sculpture that will be placed in the ITC Sculpture Garden. The subcommittee will move into updating the Public Art Master Plan.

4. Third Street Gallery (Johnson)

Third Street Gallery’s *Silver & Gold* exhibition launches April 15. Design work for the *Ctrl+P* printmaking show is underway and Mike Sonnichsen will jury the show. The 2021 Palouse Plein Air exhibition will be hosted at the Prichard Art Gallery. The show will be in the front part of the gallery and will be up September 17-October 17. The subcommittee also discussed developing a

gallery lighting recommendation. In April the subcommittee will begin discussing the 2023 Third Street Gallery exhibition schedule.

5. Volunteer Hour Tally

6. Operational Report

- **Artwalk Registration (Christen)**

As of April 13, nine businesses had registered for Artwalk 2021. Four of those registrations were non-profit organizations and five were businesses. The registrations made for a total of 11 art/offering listings, all of which were visual art listings.

- **Arts Representation Guidelines (Cherry)**

Part of the Artwalk project has been the development of the Arts Representation Guidelines. The intent is to give businesses a sense of how different areas of the arts industry represent artists. These guidelines are inclusive of visual, literary, performing and culinary arts. Additionally, these will help businesses represent artists from both an aesthetic and economic standpoint.

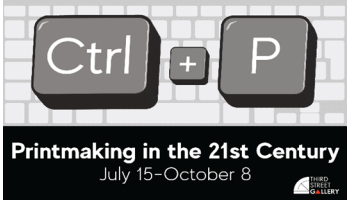
- **Arts Opportunities (Cherry)**

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2022 Call for Nominations

The Moscow Arts Commission and the City of Moscow seek nominations for the 2022 Mayor's Arts Awards, which recognizes individuals and organizations who have shown substantial support of and excellence in the arts. The event is biennial, with a nomination and selection process facilitated by City of Moscow Arts staff and members of the Moscow Arts Commission. Award recipients will be honored in online promotions and an awards ceremony, where they will receive a custom-designed artwork made by a local artist.

All nominations must be submitted online. The Selection Panel and Moscow Arts Commission will review nominations before recommending award recipients to the City of Moscow Mayor for final determination. The nominations will be evaluated based solely on submission materials, so nominators are encouraged to submit the full range of documents required in the form.

Eligibility

Individuals, students, businesses, and organizations that are makers of or advocates for the arts are eligible. Awards may be given based on excellence in all media for art-making, including the literary, performing, and visual arts. Nominees should be those individuals or organizations that have made a significant contribution to the arts and cultural climate of the City of Moscow through distinguished support and service or creative accomplishments. Nominees must be current or former residents of the Moscow region. Nominations of individuals who no longer reside in the region must focus on the nominee's contribution to the Moscow community. Previous Mayor's Arts Awards recipients are eligible for another award in a different category than the one previously received. Such candidates are eligible no fewer than 6 years after receipt of the previous award, and the nomination must be based on a different body of work than the one recognized by the previous award. Employees of the City of Moscow, current Moscow Arts Commission members, or elected officials are not eligible for nomination. Current Moscow Arts Commission and Arts Department staff members are not eligible to make nominations. Award Categories

Individual Excellence in the Arts

This award recognizes artists who have made a significant contribution to the arts in Moscow, and who have demonstrated a high degree of artistic excellence in any discipline including performing, visual, or literary arts. Considerations for selection include quality and originality of work, scope of audience, and previous awards or distinctions.

Arts Advocacy

Arts Advocacy awards celebrate individuals or families who champion the arts by supporting through their time, talent, and treasure. Selection will be based on the type and scope of service to the community as well as the nominee's commitment to support of arts and culture in Moscow.

Outstanding Achievement in Arts Education

This award honors individuals or organizations that have made an outstanding contribution that impacted the value of the arts educational curriculum or helped to provide access to the arts for students of all ages.

Youth Excellence in the Arts

This award recognizes young people who show excellence in art-making, advocacy, or other service to the creative community. Those in grades K-12 or the equivalent at time of nomination are eligible. Selection processes will not only study the scope and efficacy of the current nominee's efforts, but also the potential of the candidate to grow in their role as an artist or advocate for the cultural growth of the Moscow community.

Outstanding College or University Students in the Arts

This award recognizes area student artists who have dedicated a significant portion of their education working to develop and manifest their individual creativity within any discipline of art including performance, visual, or literary arts. Selection processes will not only study the scope and efficacy of the nominee's current efforts, but also the candidate's potential for creative and professional growth in the future.

Outstanding Contributions as a Business

Businesses or organizations that have made outstanding contributions to the advancement, excellence, and support of the arts in Moscow are eligible for this award. The selection panel will consider the type of support offered to the arts as well as the efficacy of the organization's connections and service to the community.

Lifetime Achievement in the Arts

Lifetime achievement awards are reserved for those individuals whose contributions to the arts, over a lifetime, have made a lasting and profound impact on the artistic and cultural life of the Moscow area. Nomination materials should demonstrate a track record of community participation, industry and peer recognition, and high-quality, original approaches to art-making and advocacy. Nomination materials should demonstrate how the nominee's lifetime of dedication to the development and support of the arts will sustain the Moscow arts community into the future.

The Mayor reserves the right to modify the number of awards or the assignment of awards to nominees based on the content of nominations. Nominees will be evaluated on the basis of the breadth, depth, and potential of their work and its impact on the Moscow area. The Selection Panel, Moscow Arts Commission, and Mayor will review nomination materials based on their demonstration of the values described in each award category.

Submission Requirements

1. Nominee contact information (phone number, email, mailing address)
2. Resume or CV
3. Work samples, link to website, and appropriate social media channels
4. Letter of Support from nominator
5. Additional Letter of Support from at least one community member
6. Nominator contact information (phone number, email, mailing address)

Awardee Selection Process

1. The MAC will identify a Selection Panel comprised of less than a quorum of MAC members. These Selection Panel assignments will be created in an action during a regular MAC meeting. Those who submit a nomination during the current award cycle are ineligible to participate on the selection panel. Similarly, individuals with business or family conflicts of interest will not be invited to participate in forming the awardee recommendation to the MAC and the Mayor.
2. The Selection Panel will review, score, and comment on all nominations using a review form in Submittable. This will be recorded as part of the permanent event history.
3. The full MAC will not view all nominations prior to the Selection Panel deliberation. Arts staff will forward only those nominations that the Selection Panel recommends for awards.
4. Deliberations on nominations identified by the Selection Panel will take place in a regular MAC meeting.
5. Arts staff will forward MAC recommendations for award recipients to the Mayor.

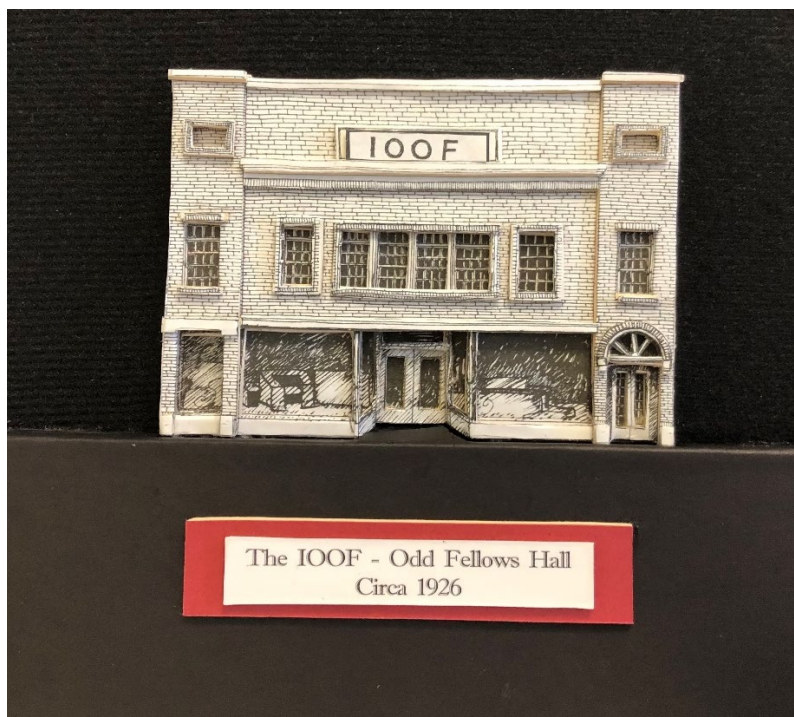
Award Maker Selection Process

Mayor’s Arts Award winners are honored in a variety of ways, including social media promotions, an awards ceremony, a commemorative certificate, and an artwork made by a regional artist. This artist is contracted to make a total of seven artworks, one for each published award category. City of Moscow Artist Directory enrollees will be invited to submit proposals to make these artwork awards. Upon solicitation and receipt of these proposals, Arts staff will bring the submitted materials to the Events and Programs subcommittee for review. That subcommittee will create a recommendation to forward to the MAC, and following a majority vote by the Commission, Arts staff will facilitate all contracts and communications with the selected artist.
