REGULAR AGENDA

1. Approval of Minutes from July 8, 2021

Presentation of minutes for approval.

DuPree moved for approval of the minutes as written, seconded by Baukol. Vote by Acclamation: Ayes: (7) Unanimous. Nays: None. Abstentions: None. Motion carried.

2. Public Comment

3. Park Valley Addition Preliminary Subdivision Plat Review and Recommendation – Bill Belknap

The City recently received an application for a replat of a portion of the Southgate Third Addition called the Park Valley Addition. Staff will provide an overview of the proposal for the Commission's review and recommendation.

Belknap reviewed the preliminary subdivision replat with the proposed street changes. The Commission noticed the pedestrian walkway between Lots 3 & 4 of Block 1, to the currently undeveloped City Park. There was discussion about the vacation of right-of-way and easements needed for a replat. There was conversation about the number of lots being reduced in the replat and how that would decrease traffic for the residents. Sutton Road does not align with Fairview Drive, on the north side of Robinson Park Road. The Commission did not have any more recommendations.

4. Sierra Vista Preliminary Subdivision Plat Review and Recommendation – Bill Belknap

The City recently received an application for a replat of a portion of the Southgate Third Addition called the Sierra Vista Addition. Staff will provide an overview of the proposal for the Commission's review and recommendation.

Belknap reviewed the preliminary subdivision replat and PUD with the proposed street changes. The Commission talked about parking complications regarding the PUD's narrower private street. There would

be no on-street parking in the PUD, but private parking is required to be built on each individual lot. The Commission did not have any recommendations.

5. Woodbury Preliminary Subdivision Plat Review and Recommendation – Bill Belknap

The City recently received an application for annexation, rezone and platting of an approximate 17 acres parcel of land called the Woodbury Addition. Staff will provide an overview of the proposal for the Commission's review and recommendation.

Hamilton and Sumner recused themselves from the discussion on this item due to a conflict of interest and left the meeting.

Belknap reviewed the preliminary subdivision plat and PUD with the proposed street configuration, as well as the traffic study analysis that was conducted. Staff is considering a formal recommendation for pedestrian sidewalks on Mountain View Road from F Street to Slonaker Drive. That would connect with the Logos development requirement to bring pedestrian facilities from Slonaker Drive east on Mountain View to the new proposed Logos school. There continued to be discussion about what Mountain View Road was designed to handle as far as vehicle- and pedestrian-traffic. Traffic calming measures on Slonaker Drive and within the PUD and plat were discussed. A traffic study for the proposed project was completed which indicated that they additional traffic could be accommodated by the existing roadway system with no significant impact upon service levels. The Commission did not have any recommendations.

Intercity Transit Subcommittee Report

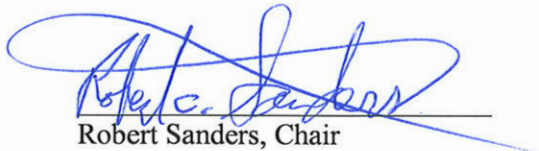
