1. Latah Human Rights Task Force Report

The MLK Breakfast was a success with 90 attending by Zoom. The Art and Essay Contest is still open. The award presentation for the winners will be on February 27. Attendance will be limited to the winner's family.

2. Monica Ramirez Presentation

The Commission, along with the UI Women's Center, CAMP Program and others, is co-sponsoring a presentation by Monica Ramirez. The date for the presentation is to be determined.

3. Restorative Justice Event

There was no update on the Restorative Justice Event.

4. Andrew Becker Memorial Artwork Panel

There were no submissions for the memorial artwork. Some alternative options have been developed which the donor has expressed enthusiasm for. Approval will be sought by the Moscow Art Council and City Council for this new direction.

5. Anti-Semitism Incidents

Joann Muneta penned a letter regarding the anti-Semitism incident in Boise. Twenty-four individuals signed the letter. It will be sent to the Governor, Lt. Governor, District V Legislators, and Congressional Delegates. The letter has been released in Boise. An ad may be placed in the Daily News. The Daily News will run the letter and will provide a link listing the names of those who signed it. There was discussion about requests to revive the Northwest Coalition of Human Rights.

6. Spring Social Justice Event

There was discussion regarding topics for future social justice events:

- COVID Health/Economic impact due to the inequities in health status and pushback on healthcare workers.
- There is much burnout and loss among healthcare workers. People are losing their jobs and people do not want to work.
- May is American Pacific Islander / Asian month. There was a suggestion to collaborate with the American Pacific Islander group by having a rally and speaker. An event could be held through Zoom or in person.
- Deprogramming white supremacists to understand where hate is coming from and what it takes to change.

7. Food Insecurity

There was no update.

8. Moscow as an Inclusive Community Discussion

This item is on the agenda each month for ideas /suggests to make Moscow more welcoming. Are there groups who do not feel safe or welcome? Are there any groups that need to be reached out to?
