5. Portable Collection Donation Proposal (ACTION)

Phil and Sandra Deutchman, professors emeriti at UI and WSU, respectively, have offered two works from their collection to be included in the City of Moscow Portable Collection. These include *Origins*, a 70" x 48" work made by Sandra Deutchman in 1992. This acrylic on canvas painting is valued at \$5500 and would need to be located in a permanent and secure display location. A location has been identified inside the Finance Department that would not only be secure, but would also be highly accessible for public viewing. The second artwork is by George Wray, longtime friend of the Deutchmans as well as prolific artist and University of Idaho professor. This untitled work is a 12" x 12" neon piece that, as with Deutchman's painting, would need to be installed in a relatively permanent location. Its value is around \$1000.

Following discussion and a vote by a majority of MAC members to recommend acceptance of the donation, Arts staff will work with the Legal Department to draft agreements for review by City Council alongside the donation proposal. Artwork will be installed an insured pending Council approval.

6. MACTivities at June 16 Artwalk Season Finale (DISCUSSION)

The Artwalk Season Finale street fair now includes Kidwalk, a section of the event footprint designed for children and families. Booths in this area are focused on art vending, demonstration, and/or interactive displays. City Commission and Departments are invited to share arts-focused outreach in this area, and registration for these groups is free-of-charge. Artists, art clubs, educators, businesses, and non-profit organizations are also welcome to sign up, with a registration cost of \$50. As the primary Commission host of Artwalk, the MAC is encouraged to present an interactive art feature at the event, perhaps including the Moscow Poet Laureate or other program-related feature. Upon discussion and consensus about an appropriate presentation, staff and MAC members will determine the best method for further development of plans.

7. Collective Paper Aesthetics (DISCUSSION)

Recreation and Community Events staff have expressed interest in collaborating to bring a STEAM education activity to Moscow. Collective Paper Aesthetics is based in Rotterdam, and produces kits that facilitate pop-up architectural experiences for children and families. If MAC discussion reveals interest in this as an Arts Education feature, staff will conduct more research into financial and operational investments required. 5. 2022 ITC Sculpture Garden Selection Panel (ACTION ITEM)

Section V.C.2.A of the 2021 Public Art Guidelines state that the selection panel for the annual opportunity shall be made up of the following member types:

1. Voting members:
 - a. Intermodal Transit Center Staff Member (1)
 - b. UI Art + Architecture Faculty or Graduate Student (1)
 - c. UI Facilities Staff Member (1)
 - d. Moscow Arts Commission Member (1)
 - e. Member of Artist Community (1)
2. Non-voting members:
 - a. Arts Program Manager (Selection Panel facilitator)
 - b. City staff members acting in a technical advisory capacity

Following a majority vote of MAC members to recommend a slate of selection panel members, Arts staff will facilitate viewing of submissions, scheduling, and selection processes.

PROPOSED ACTION: Recommend individuals to serve on the 2022 ITC Sculpture Garden Selection Panel, or take such other action deemed appropriate.

McCleary asked for an ITC Staff Member recommendation and Ben Aiman among others were considered. Cherry mentioned that there was concern over low UI Facilities Staff Members but would reach out to gauge interest this year. As the UI Art + Architecture Faculty or Graduate Student, McCleary suggested contacting Anra Rowley and Kristin LeVier as a Member of the Artist Community. Clancy volunteered to serve as the MAC Commission Member on the selection panel.

Johnson moved, Foard seconded to recommend the discussed slate of ITC Sculpture Garden selection panel members. Roll Call Vote: Ayes: Unanimous. Nays: None. Abstentions: None.

6. MACTivities at June 16 Artwalk Season Finale (DISCUSSION)

The Artwalk Season Finale street fair now includes Kidwalk, a section of the event footprint designed for children and families. McCleary recapped the topic of the MACTivities event at the June 16 Artwalk Season Finale and the Commission discussed appropriate activities for the event. The Artwalk layout and the reasoning for adding Kidwalk were mentioned, as host locations could be difficult to navigate with children. Collaborative projects such as paper collage or tape murals were discussed, as well as the idea of generating a project that could later displayed in a City building. Material needs for a paper collage project were evaluated and the Commission decided to discuss this project further at the April Commission meeting.

2. Staff Report (Cherry)

MAC Code Update

Cherry announced that the MAC Code update was complete and the MAC Mission was included in the purpose and duties of the MAC Code. Cherry would provide copies of the MAC Code and the updated orientation materials for the April or May Commission meeting.

Becker @ ITC Sculpture Garden

Cherry reviewed that at the last meeting, the Commission moved to recommend and direct hire, J. Casey Doyle for the Becker Memorial at the ITC Sculpture Garden. This item was reviewed and approved by the City Council. Cherry explained that there will be two phases to the project. After the contract is signed by the Becker Memorial Donor and Doyle, designs for the sculpture will be reviewed. The Donor will recommend a direction to the MAC, who will review and send to the City Council. The designs are expected to be ready around May. In the second phase, a contract will be generated for the artwork commission with fabrication and installation expected in the fall.

June Artwalk Registration

Cherry announced the opening of registration for the June 16 Artwalk Finale and encouraged outreach for Art Vendor/Demonstrators and Host Locations. Cherry mentioned that this registration type is a good opportunity for businesses away from the Main Street corridor to participate in the Artwalk Season Finale.

March Artwalk Outreach

Cherry reported that there were six registered host locations for the March 17 Artwalk: Allegra, Revolver, Moscow Contemporary, Intrigue, One World Cafe, and City Hall. Additionally, Palouse Women Artists will conduct their monthly Drawing Circle in City Hall Council Chambers, BKS will have a display in the Box Gallery, and *Un-Fancy* is still open in The Third Street Gallery. Stoops, Clark, and Foard volunteered to attend Artwalk this month.
