The City of Moscow received a letter from Dwight Curtis, Ph.D. requesting the Parks and Recreation Commission make a recommendation to City Council naming the pickleball courts at Ghormley Park the “Damon Burton Pickleball Courts.” Resolution No. 2004-19 establishes a formal policy and process for naming public park lands and recreational facilities and allows for naming specific areas within parks. On May 26, 2022, the Parks and Recreation Commission approved a motion to begin a sixty-day public comment period as described in Resolution 2004-19. The public comment period closed on August 16, 2022.

### 3. Consideration of Additional Parkland Dedication for Phase 1 of the Edington Subdivision (ACTION ITEM) – David Schott

**PROPOSED ACTIONS:** Recommend approval of deferring the additional 0.69 acres of parkland dedication for phase 1 of the Edington Subdivision until phase 2 of the development; or take other such action deemed appropriate.

Schott recapped 2021 phase 1 parkland dedication. 2022 Subdivision would increase 0.69 acres to have over three miles of public pathways and in addition a centrally located park with a relatively flat topography. The park would be more centrally located within the housing development.
