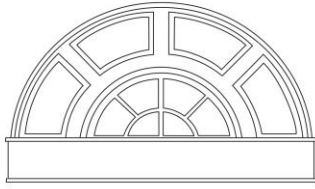

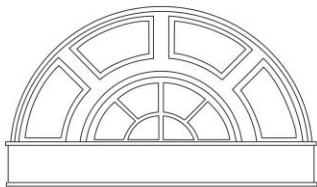

Show Description

The Third Street Gallery's exhibition **Photojournalism on the Palouse** offers viewers a closer look at images made by professional photojournalists as well as those emerging in the field. While most encounters with this kind of photography are either on newsprint or in the fast-scrolling landscape of the internet, this exhibition is an opportunity for photographers to share their favorite images in a space where viewers can slow down to take a longer look. The work of these artists serves an important function by accompanying daily news stories, but the Third Street Gallery's show celebrates the newspaper photograph as a work of art. Far beyond simple snapshots, well-timed newspaper photographs communicate through the language of subject matter and composition as they illuminate our shared human story.

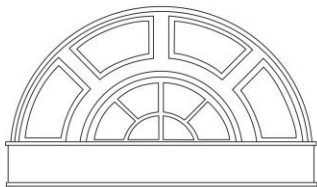

About the Third Street Gallery

The Third Street Gallery is located inside the Moscow City Hall, and features artwork presentation locations on the first, second, and third floors as well as on the staircase walls between floors. The building was designed in 1911 by architect James Knox Taylor, and was formerly called the Moscow Federal Building. Entered in National Register of Historic Places in 1973 as a Second Renaissance Revival brick building, the structure now houses essential City offices and meeting spaces such as the City Council Chambers. The Third Street Gallery is an important part of this building, as it provides a space for art in the heart of downtown Moscow.

Artistic direction for the Third Street Gallery is crafted collaboratively by City of Moscow Arts Department Staff and members of the Moscow Arts Commission. Because the Third Street gallery is in a public, family-oriented space, the Moscow Arts Commission and Arts Department staff reserve the right to review all submissions to determine the suitability of the artwork shown.

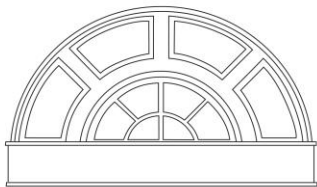

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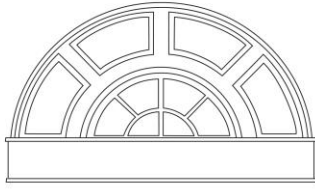
