The meeting was called to order at 5:13 pm.

REGULAR AGENDA

1. Approval of Pathways Commission July 12, 2022 Minutes (ACTION ITEM)

Presentation of minutes for approval.

PROPOSED ACTIONS: Approve minutes as presented; approve minutes with amendments; or provide staff further direction.

Bacon moved to approve the minutes as presented. Heckendorn seconded. Roll Call Vote: Ayes: Unanimous. Nays: None. Motion carried.

2. Public Comment and Response to Previous Comments (limited to 10 minutes)

There were none.

3. Consideration of the Wildrose Court Subdivision Preliminary Plat (ACTION ITEM) – David Schott

A developer has submitted a preliminary plat to the City. As part of the preliminary plat, the developer has identified and proposed a twenty (20') foot corridor as proposed parkland dedication. The Pathways Commission will discuss the parkland dedication corridor as proposed.

PROPOSED ACTIONS: Recommend approval of the parkland dedication proposal for the Wildrose Court subdivision; or take other action deemed appropriate.

Schott gave a PowerPoint presentation and wanted to hear the Pathways commissioners' opinions on accepting the proposal. Schott showed aerial views of the proposed construction and the plat map. The commissioners discussed concerns about the pathway's grade, its location, how it could connect to other pathways and parks, funding for paving the path after the area is annexed into Moscow's city limits. Each commissioner voiced an opinion that the path was a good idea but there were issues with it and would like to see changes made to it before it is installed. Zabala added that City Council would want to hear these concerns.

Bacon motioned to pass along this meeting's discussion, with items noted of changing location to adjust steepness of grade, but appreciation that the pathway is being considered. Heckendorn seconded. Roll Call Vote: Ayes: Unanimous. Nays: None. Motion carried.

4. **Report and Discussion: First Annual Pedestrian Tour (ACTION ITEM) – Tanya Denison**
The Pathways Commission will discuss what went well, what can be improved, and whether this event should be an annual event for the Commission.

PROPOSED ACTIONS: No Action, Discussion.

Since Denison was at the walking tour and not at this meeting, the discussion was tabled until the next meeting.

Next meeting: November 8, 2022 (Election Day)

Heckendorn observed numerous people walking to and from the Identity on Main apartment complex and UI Campus and hopes to see the Highway 95 Underpass construction begin soon. He feels it would be a much safer alternate route than crossing at the lights.
