Brown moved to approve the minutes as presented. Dibble seconded. Roll call vote. Ayes unanimous. Motion carried.

Bacon suggested meeting at the Ghormley park shelter and taking a tour around the University of Idaho Recreation center, onto the Paradise path and towards the new children's educational bicycling area.

Bacon motioned for the Moscow Pathway's Commission pedestrian tour to be hosted on September 19, 2023, in lieu of the September 12th, 2023 meeting. Dibble seconded. Roll call vote. Ayes: unanimous. Motion carried.

5. Consideration of the September 2, 2023 Farmers Market (ACTION ITEM) – Tanya Denison

The Pathways Commission will discuss staffing the Farmers Market. The theme approved previously was public outreach for the upcoming annual pedestrian tour. The commission will also discuss any support needs from staff leading up to the Farmers Market.

Chastain, Dibble and Denison stated they would setup at the farmers market. Support needs requested as follows: stickers, banners, fliers, coloring books.

Heckendorn makes a motion to approve the theme and staffing. Brown seconded. Roll call vote. Ayes: unanimous. Motion carried.
