1. Approval of Human Rights Commission Minutes for October 17, 2023 (ACTION ITEM)

REPORTS

1. Latah County Human Rights Task Force Report – Joann Muneta

Nominations for the Rosa Parks Award are now open. One youth and one community member will be recognized. Nomination requirements for youth include showing promise in the community. Adults' nominations will be based on their history of activities and courage. Nominations should be one page long, and instructions for submitting nominations by email are available on the website. The MLK Breakfast is in the early stages of planning. The planning committee will work with Haltinner's class, Moscow Together, and a Moscow High School Human Rights Club student.

2. Sheikh Award

Dr. Sydney Freeman Jr. gave a great acceptance speech. The event went well.

3. Renaming Indian Hills Park

Haltinner did not attend the meeting but sent information to the Commission, which Agidius read. Haltinner's students have done their research for the action project and should be in contact with the Commission soon.

4. Future Social Justice Forums

Agidius suggested the Commission plan for only two other events this year, which tie into previously discussed topics. Suggestions included:

- Another Human Rights 101 Class about human rights and their importance. Council Liaison Parker may take on this task.
- Showcase human rights differences and similarities at the international, national, state, county, and local levels.
- Speakers from the World Relief Refugee Center, the Human Rights Institute in Coeur d'Alene, the Latah Human Rights Task Force, and the Poverty Law Center. An honorarium for speakers was suggested, and Agidius stated she would like to keep it a low-cost event.

It was noted that Sexual Awareness Month is in April, Human Rights Day is in December, and Black History Month is in February.

This item will be added to the December agenda to discuss more structured plans and speakers.

5. Report on Hate Incidents / Moscow as an Inclusive Community

There was no report.

Muneta mentioned that the letter to the Palouse Mall was returned due to an insufficient address and would be hand-delivered.

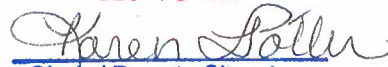
