The meeting was called to order at 4:13 p.m.

Joshua Hurwit, US Attorney for Idaho, is collaborating with the task force on this event. An outline and flyer for the forum were made available to attendees. Law enforcement, local organizations, and individuals will participate. The Latah County Human Rights Task Force will pay for the

venue and has asked the commission to purchase and serve refreshments. There will also be a tribal circle. Inclusive Communities Month's events will be publicized separately as well as a part of Inclusive Communities Month's announcements. This event will be held on Monday, September 16, from 6:00 – 8:30 p.m. in the 1912 Center.

Mowrer moved to approve up to \$600 for co-sponsorship of the United Against Hate Forum to fund refreshments, and Awwad-Rafferty seconded the motion. Vote: Ayes: Seven. Nays: None. Abstentions: None. Motion carried.

4. Host the Braver Angels Workshop (ACTION ITEM)
