**4. Limiting of Vendor Types (ACTION ITEM)**

The 2025 Market season included 159 Vendors eligible for participation. Since the expansion onto E. 4<sup>th</sup> Street, the Market now hosts 110 spaces but continues to experience waitlists particularly for Craft Artisan Vendors. Staff has put together a report that shows the number of Vendor types, number of weeks at capacity, and number of Vendors on waitlists. Commission members and staff have fielded concerns regarding whether the Market has reached a point in placing a moratorium on certain Vendor types, or if changes need to be considered to the current process for granting space assignments and/or accepting Vendors. Vendor acceptance is thoroughly outlined in Appendix 6 of the Market Handbook. Any proposed changes to acceptance, moratoriums, etc. must be vetted by the Policy Subcommittee for further review by the entire Commission.

**PROPOSED ACTIONS:** Task Policy Subcommittee with review of limiting Vendor types in their annual scope of work or take such other action deemed appropriate.

### **4. Halloween Costume Contest (ACTION ITEM)**

*This will be the sixth annual costume contest to celebrate the end of the Market season. Attached for review is the proposed in-person format.*

*Traditionally, we have hosted three to four judges, an emcee, and additional volunteers to assist with contestant check-in. The contest has been held from 9 am to 12 pm, with a formal presentation of awards at a City Council meeting in November. Vendor Colter and Co Photography & Events has offered photography services for the event.*

Argona provided information from the 2024 Halloween contest, as described above, and requested feedback or changes. The Commission discussed Junior age group category possibly not being as popular. It was discussed to keep contest age groups the same as the 2024 season and reevaluate for the 2026 season. Martinet, Strong and Larson will act as contest judges, Blankenship and Manning as substitutes if needed. Argona indicated that councilmember Lewis expressed interest as an emcee if needed.

### 1. Community Events Manager report

Argona shared the Manager report (see attached), including brief plans for advertising America's Farmers Market Celebration next year. It was suggested to explain the importance of voting to the Vendors during the spring orientation meeting. Upcoming commission term expirations for Alvarez, Smith and Manning were announced. A conversation opened about the possibility of expanding the Markets footprint to encompass the remainder of Fourth Street, opening an additional 14 spaces, and included a discussion on the pros and cons of the side street location for the Vendors there. Overall impression is in favor of adding space with proper signage, anchor vendors, updated bell brigade routes, and social media advertising.

*Argona reviewed the list of above activities. Discussion ensued about leveraging e-newsletters to garner interest and awareness. Manning and Martinet explored the idea of including a reception that served as a thank you to the City for its efforts in hosting the Market. There was consensus that a Wed. or Thu. evening in mid- to late August would be best.*

2. **Review Vendor interest in commemorative Market activities**
  - a. **78% are interested in providing products for Market Box Giveaways**
  - b. **19% are interested in using 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary logo with license-to-use contract**
  - c. **9% are interested in using 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary packaging with their own products**

*Argona reviewed Vendor responses on 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary participation. Questions were posed to Vendors in the 2025 application. Based on responses, Argona asked the subcommittee if it is worth pursuing initial anniversary ideas like bulk packaging and license-to-use anniversary logo contract. Subcommittee members felt that a*

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*more reasonable route in lieu of packaging was to offer a stamp, or provide anniversary logo in graphic form for use in form of a sticker.*

*The subcommittee expressed interest in pursuing the license-to-use contract, indicating that working with a smaller list of Vendors might bode well. Proposed timeline for this aspect was as follows:*

- *Nov. – Vendors notified of submission period*
- *Thu., Jan. 1 – Submission period open for requests for proposals (RFP). Invite only.*
- *Sun., Mar. 8 – Submission period closes for RFP*
- *Week of Mar. 23 – Subcommittee RFP selection*
- *Tue., Apr. 7 – Commission approval of RFP selection*

*Subcommittee directed Argona to provide a follow-up email to Vendors who indicated participation in 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary activities following the Nov. Commission meeting.*

*There was vigorous discussion around the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary Market giveaways, which had an overwhelming participation response. Martinet suggested in lieu of cardboard boxes that staff find a wooden box, crate, or bucket option and decrease the amount purchased (between 65-100). Discussion ensued around mechanism of giveaways and the use of social media.*

### **3. Commemorative calendar timeline**

*Argona expressed concern about the timeline for the calendar due to mid-season staff training. The subcommittee proposed the following timeline:*

- *Mid-Nov. – Acceptance period open for digitized community contributions (photos, recipes, articles, etc.)*
- *Mid-Jan. – Acceptance period closed*
- *Mid-Feb. – Subcommittee to review and select contributions for feature*
- *Tue., Mar. 3 – Commission approval of selections for feature*
- *April/May – Finalize draft and print*

*Argona indicated that if the project stays on track, she is amenable to present a final draft for review by the Commission at their Tue., Apr. 7 meeting, but had concerns about requiring approval from the Commission in the form of an action item.*

*Subcommittee members reviewed the scope of work for the 2026 Handbook and opted not to make any changes to holdovers from the 2025 Handbook.*

*Subcommittee members were in favor of adding a time limit of two business day notice of absence to the Vendor Orientation policy.*

*Subcommittee members were in favor of adapting language from the Seafood Vendor subcategory definition into the Forage Vendor subcategory definition regarding private versus public land harvesting.*

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*Discussion ensued around adding products mid-season and maintaining a consistent protocol that allows for management discretion. Subcommittee is suggesting review/adding the following under "Adding Products" on page xiii:*

- *Requests to be submitted ten business days prior to products brought to Market*
- *Layout options available and what follow-up if any may be required (i.e. Site Visit versus waiting for Craft & Food Jury)*

*Alvarez provided historic management practices around Vendors adding products. During course of this discussion, concerns were brought up around Non-Ag. Vendors offering agriculture products and ensuring fair value and market price. Argona cited at least two long-time Craft Vendors who do bring surplus garden products to Market, indicating it is usually in small quantity and for a limited time.*

*Discussion ensued around product classification. Several examples were provided, with Blankenship asking how goatskin gloves might be classified if the Vendor raises and skins the goat and then fashions the gloves. Argona indicated that her interpretation would be to classify it under Value-Added, similar to goat's milk lotion. Members discussed intent, sourcing, and other scenarios as points of consideration. There was no consensus or idea put forward on how to classify foraged skulls and hides. Members agreed that items like rock and driftwood may not be sold on their own as raw materials.*
